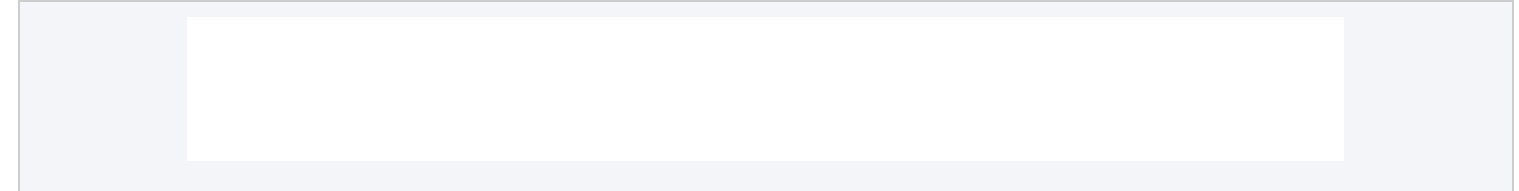

In addition to the data it provided, the study revealed insights through physician comments. When asked what the strengths of temporal artery thermometry are over other methods, responses included: "It's accurate. It's easy to use. It's fast. We like to use it in our office. We recommend it."

The survey was conducted by Pragmatic Research, Inc. and Exergen assisted in the development. Results from the survey were consistent with previous independent research involving various temperature taking methods in healthcare settings.

Exergen markets two models of the TemporalScanner thermometer: a professional version for doctors' offices and hospitals, and a consumer model sold in major retailers including Wal-Mart, Target, Walgreen's, Rite Aid, Costco, Sam's Club, Babies "R" Us, Toys "R" Us, Kroger and BJ's. More than one billion temperatures are taken each year with the TemporalScanner. It is used in thousands of hospitals, clinics, and pediatricians' offices in the country, as well as in millions of homes. For the third year in a row it is the #1 selling retail thermometer.
